President's Farewell MessageHelene Schutz



Dearest Ladies,

I want to thank each and every one of you for giving me the opportunity to serve as your 50th president over the last two years. You have been a fully supportive, enthusiastic group. The time has gone by so quickly. I can say with pride that the presidency has been an affirming experience, and barely a day has gone by without exciting things happening and a tale to tell about the **WCD**.

Together, let's take a view of the accomplishments of **2021-2023**. This couldn't be the work of one; it is all of those who constantly put service above self, step

forward and pull in the same direction. Volunteerism *par excellence*. The core of our strength, the executive board, has worked tirelessly and competently. They have brought creative ideas to fruition.

These are some of the newest outcomes and highlights of the past two years:

- The Hat (2021) and The Doll (2022) Expositions brought treasures to light from the WCD community and related them to individual memories. Due to the great appeal of these two expos, we are initiating plans for completing the Trilogy, with The Handbag Expo in the fall of 2023.
- Our charitable endeavors have increased by more than 30%. We have hosted inspiring representatives from our lead charities. A collection truck was filled to capacity for **Hour Children** (2022) with over \$2500 credit given to us for these donations. This event was remarkably successful and extended into the broader community. Currently baby gifts are being collected for **Bridge to Life** to help the needy.
- Money has been invested by our treasurer in a \$5000 CD. I am currently requesting more of this CD strategy be applied to our cash deposits, as interest rates are clearly up without risk. It is important to note our exquisite as well as lucrative tabletop décor. Raffles of these items brought in \$3100 in profits and \$209 in charitable contributions over the past two years. We are financially secure at this time.
- An Education Committee was formed to implement a pilot program with PS 98 for encouraging creativity in both student writing and artwork. We launched a contest with themes related to honoring women. There has been an overwhelming response. Monetary prizes, ribbons and certificates are being given to outstanding 4th and 5th grade entrants.
- The History Committee has archived our earliest existing materials and records. They are in the Central Library in Jamaica. This project is up to date as well as ongoing.
- NewsBytes and WCD Website are constantly being updated and curated. The Internet is the key to our organization's effective direct

communication.

- We experienced our first Lunar New Year Celebration in February with Chinese classical dance, music, and calligraphy as well as red envelopes with New Year's money.
- We have planned visits to our eldest recorded executive board member, now 105 years old, in her assisted living home in Great Neck.
- Plans are underway for the Memorial Day Parade. It has been 14
 years since we have participated. A float, new banner, and uniforms are
 currently being designed for the event. Men will participate for the first
 time.
- It has been my pleasure to periodically send relevant and outstanding cultural and entertainment videos. Membership has had a very positive response to them.
- In terms of growth and development, our membership is now 100 strong. Two new members were inducted in March. Among our members are women from diverse backgrounds who carry with them a lifetime of information about everything from family and personal issues as well as the best footwear, doctors, and restaurants. A primary goal has been to encourage greater friendship and interaction between members. Let's keep this idea at the forefront.
- **Game Day**, which meets on a monthly basis, has gained momentum, and attracted a greater following over time. An additional incentive to socialization has been ordering delicious lunches at the Douglaston Club.
- Now that covid is a plague of the past, our Antiques, Theatre,
 Museums, Music, Potpourri, Programs, Book Club, and the tradition of poinsettia arrangements have been revitalized, up and running.
 Sadly, many more sympathy and get-well cards had to be sent during this

period by The Sunshine Committee.

 Our grand, innovative annual luncheon can proceed without restrictions. Last year's members' fashion show was the first featuring our beautiful ladies as runway models. Our profits were an unprecedented \$5461.07. This was due in part to the inclusion of local groups and organizations, who came to celebrate our 106th anniversary.

Our club is thriving with all committees maximized. From this vantage point of the presidency, I can see behind the scenes and know that none of this success is magically happening. It is the result of the long, hard work of many.

These last 2 years have changed my life and hopefully have changed yours for the better as well.

In closing, I would like to heartily thank the board and all **WCD** members once again.

It is now my final duty to pass on the club gavel to your new, capable, and trustworthy President **Maria DiChiara**.
